• Wanda Kelly, travelling with Phyllis Buchner, shared this news from HFR UCWs AGM





- New Horseshoe Falls UCW banner will be presented this July at the UCW 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration in Sydney, Nova Scotia - Banner creator is incoming President, Marilyn Johnston. The banner will travel with members of HFR UCW who are attending the conference.
- Truth and Rights Justice and Right Relations - Guest Presenter: Marilyn Johnston, incoming HFR UCW President, herself an indigenous woman, gave an insightful and eloquent presentation and shared her experiences from her visit to Sandy Lake First Nation and spoke of their struggle with accessing clean water.
- Celebrating United Church of Canada's 97<sup>th</sup> Anniversary (June 1925 – June 2022) Rev. Robert Lawson, President Horseshoe Falls Regional Executive Council and worship leader for the HFRUCW Annual General

Meeting, brought attendees back in time with the photo from the big meeting on June 25, 1925 at Mutual Street Arena, Toronto, which heralded the beginning of our church at the Act of Union.

Rev. Lawson told the story of his grandmother, who claimed she was there on the day. Rev. Lawson has poured over the photo looking for her, but does not think there were too many women present, because of the lack of hats evident in the picture! Rev. Lawson did stress that women were indeed present, but likely in the more traditional ways we know the women of the church to have always been present --preparing the meal for the meeting, fundraising, champions for many causes and being present in a myriad of other ways.

As you look at the photo below it is a sobering thought to think how far within our church structure the role of women has evolved. All this time the UCW, coming from the WA and WMS traditions, has been present, working to support the work of the church and stepping up for noteworthy causes and campaigns.




Mutual Street Arena - Toronto - June 25, 1925

## Bay of Quinte UCW East Central Ontario On-line Book **Club with Betty Turcott**

Betty Radford Turcott's latest book, A Circle of Stones, gave Bay of Quinte UCW East Central Ontario Region a wonderful opportunity to form an online book discussion group. Tuesday evenings in March, we met by Zoom to share and deepen our experience of a book that brings to life the story of Sarai and Abram. When Betty joined us the final week, we gained insight into her writing experience, the character of Sarai and the support and wisdom that Sarai, and we, receive from women met along life's journey.

Meeting for an hour, one night a week for four weeks, was good for our group. Each gathering began with a check-in on the week's focus: sisterhood in your life, a word or phrase to name God, a 'stone' or memento you cherish. With 17 in the group, we used breakout rooms of 4 - 5 people, each with a leader. A planning team developed discussion prompts for each week, but A Circle of Stones is a many-layered novel and we never ran out of things to discuss. After the allotted hour each week, many chose to stay on to talk and the group became a circle of sisters in itself.

Typical comments: "I liked the breakout rooms. It was good that everyone had a time to have their say." "The general focus on personal experience I found refreshing." "Betty Turcott holds a dear spot in my heart, as she does with others as well. What a blessing to be able to call her friend and have her join the group to discuss her book." And many asking: "When can we do it again!"

National UCW has approved the UCW Individual Membership. This membership is for women who no longer have access to a local Community of Faith UCW Unit.


Just as when a United Church closes, all members of the congregation are still members of *The United Church of Canada*; so too, when a UCW Unit closes the members are still UCW women within their congregations and the wider church.

Each year the Local Community of Faith UCW Units complete a "Statistics Sheet" to report membership numbers, names and contact information for key Executive positions, and the names of women blessed to receive a Life Membership Pin and Certificate. Later this year the new statistics form will also give the option to include the number of UCW women in each Area, Region/District who register as "Individual" members.

**Enroll for Individual Membership** You are important to us! If, as a UCW woman, you are living your purpose in your community of faith, but may not have access to an active UCW Unit, reach out, sign up, and be counted!

Contact your Area, Region/District UCW to request a form. You will be asked to provide your contact information and the everimportant email address. A UCW Executive member will then share information about upcoming events within UCW locally and nationally, and you can request copies of the National UCW Newsletter, *Keeping in Touch*, to stay connected to other UCW women.


