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"In 2016, the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the US and Canada and The United Church 6 7 of Canada determined that a full communion agreement would provide an opportunity to bear 8 witness to the importance Christian unity in North America, and strengthen the ministry of both

9 of our denominations. "

10 "The two denominations have understood a full communion partnership as a living and growing 11 relationship. This partnership doesn't simply mean that we accept one another. Rather, we

- 12 embrace each other fully in the witness of Christians, the ministries of the Church, and the
- 13 mission of God. In this covenantal relationship, we commit to being one Church, not in merger

14 but in God's gift of unity, that serves the world that God so loves. The two churches will learn

15 how to live in this covenantal relationship through rich theological conversations, enhanced

- 16 witness and mission, and diverse spiritual life and worship."
- 17 "In full communion, the two churches would affirm one another's ordered ministries as
- 18 belonging to the one ministry of Jesus Christ. Such ministers in one church will be recognized as
- 19 ministers in the other church. Each may serve, when invited, as minister to the other. Though
- 20 ministerial credentials are immediately recognized, each minister will need to go through the
- 21 standard processes established by each denomination to gain official "standing" within the
- denomination. "(Statements from the Full Communion Agreement) 22
- 23 The following processes have been established for the orderly exchange of ministry personnel provided
- 24 for in the full communion agreement in keeping with these stated expectations.
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26 In full recognition that our two communions hold differing views in matters pertaining to sacramental

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- theology, and that this "full communion partnership is a living, growing relationship, ministers seeking a 28 call in the partner communion will adhere to the sacramental theology and practices of the calling
- 29 body." 30
- 31 It is noted that calling/appointing bodies and ministers are responsible for adhering to the required
- 32 immigration laws, pension and health care for employment in Canada and the United States.
- 33
- 34 To be eligible for service under this agreement ministers must have served as an ordained or diaconal 35 minister (United Church of Canada) in the originating denomination for at least three years. Ministers 36 contemplating serving within this partnership are advised that the process will take a significant period
- 37 of time to meet immigration and church requirements.
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- 40 COMING TO THE UNITED CHURCH OF CANADA

41 All ordained ministers in good standing who desire to seek a call in The United Church of Canada shall 42 submit to the General Council Office of The United Church of Canada: 43 44 Through the Region where standing is held, their validated Search and Call ministerial profile • 45 (this includes confirmation of good standing, an Oxford Document Criminal Background Check 46 completed within the last six months, and notation of any disciplinary action). 47 48 If the minister resided in Canada at any point over the previous seven years, a Level 2 police 49 check valid within the past six months will also be required 50 51 Demonstration of familiarity with the history and polity of The United Church of Canada (done in 52 consultation with the General Council Office) 53 54 Confirmation of completion of two web-based study programs that all United Church of Canada 55 ministers are required to complete: Boundary Issues for Church Leaders and Racial Justice 56 Awareness. The primary focus of the interview will be 69 the understanding of the context and ministry of The United Church of Canada and the applicant's 70 interest in serving in the church. 71 72 Upon completion of the above process General Council staff will make a determination as to whether 73 the applicant is eligible to serve in The United Church of Canada. If it is determined that the applicant is 74 not eligible to serve, the General Council Office will indicate if or when the applicant may reapply. 75 76 If the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the US and Canada, hereafter referred to as CC(DOC), 77 applicant is determined to be eligible by the General Council Office for mutual recognition in The United 78 Church of Canada, the CC(DOC)minister will: 79 Receive an invitation to establish a ministry profile on ChurchHub, the online registry of ministry 80 personnel in The United Church of Canada. CC(DOC) ministry partners are responsible for 81 applying and seeking an interview with a United Church of Canada community of faith that is 82 registered on ChurchHub as seeking to call or appoint a minister. 83 84 While a call is without term limit, an appointment must be renewed annually by mutual 85 agreement of the minister, community of faith, and Regional Council.

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87	• Maintain all on-going requirements for good standing in The United Church of Canada and all
88	on-going requirements for standing in the CC(DOC). Standing for a CC(DOC) minister will be held
89	in the Region where the minister is currently serving while awaiting a call to a UCCanada
90	congregation and will be subject to that Region's requirements to maintain standing. Once the
91	minister receives a call to a United Church of Canada congregation, the minister's standing
92	among the CC(DOC) will be transferred to the Region of Canada and subject to the standing
93	requirements for the Region of Canada. If a CC(DOC)ministerial profile expires while in the
94	search process, or any complaint of misconduct, disciplinary action or criminal charges emerge,
95	the Regional Minister where the minister's standing is currently held will notify The United
96	Church of Canada General Council Office. This action or charge may result in withdrawal of
97	Ministry Partner status and eligibility to serve in the host denomination.
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100	COMING TO THE CHRISTIAN CHURCH (DISCIPLES OF CHRIST) IN THE US AND CANADA

111	 Provide a copy of current Ministry Personnel CV

113	 Provide a copy of the current Police Records Check Level 2 dated within the last 6 months

115	• If the minister resided in the United States at any point over the previous seven years an Oxford
116	Document Criminal Background Check completed within the last 6 months will also be required.

118	• Demonstrate familiarity with the history and polity of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in
119	the US and Canada as determined by the authorizing Region's Commission/Committee on
120	Ministry.

122	• Provide a personal statement of interest in serving in the CC(DOC) and how their journey of faith
123	relates to ministry in the CC(DOC).
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126	Upon submission of all required documents and the completion of a process of certification by a
127	Region's Commission/Committee on Ministry, The United Church of Canada minister will be directed to
128	complete a Search and Call Profile through the Office of Christian Vocations. Upon completion of the
129	Ministerial Profile, Regional Ministers may submit the Ministerial Profile to local church Search
130	Committees within their Regions for consideration. <i>The United Church of Canada minister may consider</i>
131	a geographic distribution of his/her ministerial profile that extends beyond the Canadian Region.
131	a geographic distribution of his/her himisterial profile that externs beyond the canadian hegion.
132	• Upon receiving a call to a congregation, The United Church of Canada minister will be granted
133	CC(DOC) standing for the duration of the call.
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135	 Maintain all on-going requirements for standing as determined by the Region's
136	Commission/Committee on Ministry where the minister is serving and all on-going requirements
137	for continued good standing in The United Church of Canada.
138	
139	If a United Church of Canada minister's good standing status changes while in the search process, or any
140	complaint of misconduct, disciplinary action or criminal charge emerge, then The United Church of
141	Canada Office of Vocation will notify the Regional Minister of the Region where standing is being sought
142	in the CC(DOC). This action or charge may result in withdrawal of eligibility to serve the host
143	denomination.
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146 SPECIALIZED MINISTRY SETTINGS

- 147 Ministers desiring to serve in a specialized ministry setting through Mutual Recognition are requested to
- 148 follow the same procedures established for service in a local congregation or pastoral charge. Once
- approved for partnership by the host denomination ministers may then seek employment directly
- 150 through the specialized ministry setting. Ministers serving through Global Ministries will adhere to the
- 151 protocols established by Global Ministries.
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153 **MEMBERSHIP**

- 154 United Church of Canada ministers will retain standing in their Regional Council as well as in the local
- 155 CC(DOC) congregation where they serve. CC(DOC)ministers will retain membership in a CC(DOC)
- 156 congregation within their current Region as well as in the appropriate United Church of Canada Regional
- 157 Council. This process allows the minister to have standing in both denominations.
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159 DISCIPLINARY PROCESS

- 160 Ministry partners must maintain good standing in their originating denomination and continue to meet
- 161 its ongoing requirements for good standing in the host denomination being served. In the event of any
- 162 complaint of misconduct, disciplinary action or criminal charges the processes of the denomination in
- 163 which the minister is currently serving will be followed. This may result in a withdrawal of eligibility to
- serve in the host denomination. The originating denomination will be advised when any review is
- initiated and any subsequent determinations made by the host denomination. The ongoing ecclesial
- standing will be determined by the originating denomination.
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
