2. *How do we take care of water?*
3. *Who teaches you to respect the land?*

Youth

1. *Why is it important that the people most affected lead climate conversations?*
2. *What helps you stay hopeful without ignoring what's hard?*
3. *What's one climate action you can do with friends or your community?*

Young adults

1. *How does colonization show up in climate policy and finance?*
2. *What does "right relationship" mean as a climate practice? (Resource: [Principles in Search of Right Relationship](#))*
3. *How can churches be trustworthy partners (not performative allies)?*

Adults

1. *What commitments could your congregation make that go beyond a single season?*
2. *How might worship, giving, and advocacy align more clearly with climate justice?*
