Submit your photos for United Church bulletin covers!

What we're looking for

- Symbols of church seasons and special Sundays: images that convey Epiphany, the Trinity, Lent, Palm Sunday, Easter, Union Sunday, Indigenous Day of Prayer, Thanksgiving, Peace Sunday, Remembrance Day, Children's Sunday, Advent, Christmas.
- Christian symbols: crosses (outdoors and indoors, preferably from United Churches), communion bread and wine, baptismal fonts, prayer, Bible, etc.
- Outdoor and indoor architectural details of United Churches: colourful windows, doors, steeples, banners, nativities, candles, etc.
- Images suitable for weddings and baptisms.

- Canadian landscapes (farms, lighthouses, beaches, people in nature), animals, birds, insects, trees, and flowers. We would love to see your winter photos!
- More photos from western and eastern Canada, please!

What we'll do

- We'll pay a \$100 honorarium for every photo chosen.
- We'll credit the photographer on each bulletin cover.
- We'll send you a copy of the final bulletin when they're printed.

Do's

- Send BRIGHT, colourful, crisp pictures, that are well lit.
- Take photos in all seasons.
- Send photos that have universal appeal that anyone and any church can relate to.
- Send large, high-resolution images.
- Avoid cropping photos.
- **Remember: Bulletins are vertical—we need TALL photos.**
- **Do get written permission/consent from any people in your photos. Model release forms can be found on our Submit Your Photos webpage.**

Don'ts

- Please do not e-mail photos!
- Avoid distractions such as hydro wires, cars, microphones, etc. as much as possible.
- Photos shot at night or that are very dark may not work.
- **Avoid adding special effects, filters, or text.**

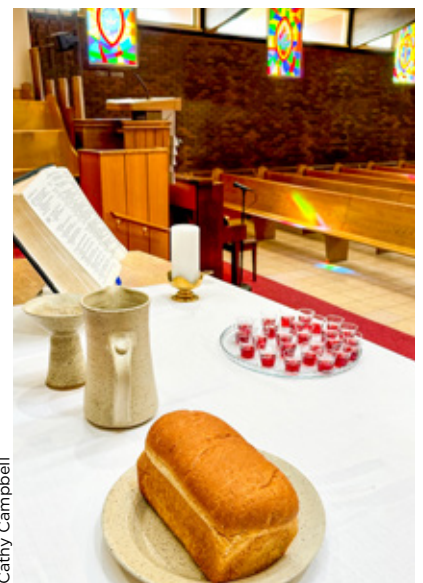
Photo quality is important!

Images should be sharp when enlarged to 5" x 10". Save jpegs at maximum quality; file size should be large (ranging from 2-10 MB). Be wary of using cellphone cameras—not all cameras are created equal!
